WELCOME Team members, Family members and Board Members to the 7th ANNUAL TEAM MEMBER APPRECIATION TEA. This year we will be honoring 48 team members who have worked at Menno from 5 to 35 years! This is an accumulation of 505 years of service!

We are also recognizing those with Excellent Attendance as well as the special awards for Safety Champion, Creative Solutions and Living our Values.

When we gather together in this way to celebrate our success, we are reminded of the incredible privilege it is to share our skills, our hearts and our lives with the residents and their families. Our staff are the heart of Menno Place – and many of you have been "caught in the moment" this year. Throughout the year, managers and family members have shared with us the outstanding moments that you have had as you have lived out the SERVICE values of Menno Place. We also log compliments and cards from Family and Residents in Worxhub to keep a record of the good work that is appreciated by those we serve.

This year, we recorded 127 compliments from family and residents are recorded in Worxhub.

We know this only scratches the surface of what you are all doing to serve residents each day. It doesn't really tell the complete and powerful story of how you work to serve, comfort and care for residents and their families each day – and yet, it tells us something – it tells us that people notice the skilled, kind and compassionate care their loved ones receive here at Menno Place.

Here are some examples of what is being said about the Menno Place Team:

Thank you to the **Menno Home staff** for providing our family with great comfort during mum's last days and at her passing. The dignity that was shown was truly appreciated by our family.

Open House Apartments - A person who was touring in our Apartments open house said, "Your grounds and gardens were very interesting and extensive. What a pleasant surprise. A most calming and comfortable environment to live within!"

A nervous resident approached the **Terrace East receptionist, Claire**, asking if she could help her operate her shower. She had not showered for nearly a month because she couldn't figure out the taps. She told Claire that she was very nervous to ask about it but decided to take the risk because, "I know you are gentle, so I thought it would be okay. It is okay."

A resident moved from Hospital to Home. Her spouse dropped by **Garry Janzen**, **Life Enrichment Coordinator**'s office. He was thankful that his wife was adjusting so well to the move and thanked the staff for their excellent service.

Every time we visited mom in **Menno Home E1**, she said, "thank you for bringing me here to Menno. They take very good care of me." She lived here for 9 years.

I say this often, but, "thank you for all you do for my dad." – a daughter speaking of **Menno Home E2**

A daughter shared how much she appreciates the staff on **Menno Hospital E2.** From the care to the personal love and attention, we appreciate you so much. Both mom and dad live together here.

I want to say a big thank-you on behalf of my family for all the loving care you provided for my mother on **E1 Menno Home.** First and foremost, thank-you for giving our mother the opportunity to die in the comfort of her own room You provided her with excellent care and met all of her physical and spiritual needs with kind and compassionate care.

On Hospital W2 - Thank you to the care staff for their compassionate care. While all the staff were great, we were especially touched by the incredible empathy and

love of Charlotte and Jessica at such a difficult time. May God cover you with all His Blessings.

To the whole team at **Menno Hospital** - The Ida you met was not the Ida we knew and loved as our mother. She changed and it was difficult. Thank you for all your care and we appreciate all the efforts you made to make her time here as enjoyable as possible.

At the **Home Chalet**, a resident's daughter called for an update on her mom. After the update, she said that she is very happy with her mom's care and said that her mom is much happier since being here – she is even better than when she was at home.

To the **W2 Home "Honey Bunch"** – Doris lived on W2 for 7 years. She changed when she came into care on W2 – from anxious and angry to knowing she was loved and loving the care team back. This love was incarnated in the many kind comments staff wrote in their sympathy card and by the two care aides who attended Doris' graveside service.

To the Menno East 1 Hospital team – Heather, Shaun, Frank, Laura, Michelle and Jas – you instantly come to mind as people whom I want to thank for such great care of my mom, Jean. Their constant kindness and patience are impressive. Heather's happy and gracious spirit has often encouraged me when things have been heart wrenching with my mom. Given that there are many new care aides, I often don't know their names, but value that they, too, are patient and kind.

Menno Place – the team at Menno Place "walk their talk" says one daughter who has moved her mother through levels of care. Everyone helped to find the right spot for my mom.

Menno Place Resident Orientation – from Terrace East to Menno Home, everyone they meet here increases our confidence in the Menno Place team. "There is a new layer of confidence added with each person that we meet. Thank you."

To the team on W2 Home - Thank you for taking such good care of mom. You were always patient with us when we struggled.

Trudy from Recreation takes the time to encourage and ask my husband if he would like to be involved. He is content and doesn't often participate. Trudy is a gem of a person and fabulous in how she interacts with my husband.

I feel very connected and thankful for the staff. They feel like family. **Gabby, an LPN** is especially close to me. I am here everyday and can see what is really happening. There is love for the residents and an amazing team of people working at **W1 Home**.

The most valuable feedback we get is from what our mom relays to us about living at **Menno Hospital E2**. She is detail oriented and very particular about what and how her needs are being met. The amazing thing is you ALL are meeting her expectations! That's incredible and not easy to do. Every person who cares for Evelyn brings a positive experience for her. You have very high standards and are always working towards keeping everything the best possible! We have nothing but thanks.

My mom and dad lived at **Terrace East** for 15 years. Thank you for the way you were consistently kind and professional with my mom's care in the last months as her health declined. Thank you for your patience with us as we navigated these changes. Thank you, in particular, for the past 10 days as she returned from hospital. You have shown her much kindness with many extra visits to her room and to the toilet, to give blankets and to give comfort. You speak kind words to her. You are all so very appreciated!

It was a gift to be by my mom's side as she crossed the finish line to her eternal home on Sunday afternoon, fulfilling the deepest longing of her heart. We have been so grateful for the care she received in **Menno Hospital for 3 years and before that, Terrace East.** Thank you to the chaplains for your faithful support, visits and spiritual care. You model such beautiful compassion and support.

At the **Family and Friends Dinner** for family members of loved ones in Home and Hospital – "It was so encouraging to meet the staff and caregivers and feel connected. Seeing the vision and forward thinking and ideas that are outside the

box from 'traditional' hospital thinking was great. What a delight and encouragement! Thank you all for all the work you are doing. Your care is visible."

Mom is very happy in her new home in **Terrace East, Assisted Living**. We all have confidence that she is safe and doing well. She spends her time knitting and has knit over 100 afghans for the homeless since she's moved in.

During mom's final day, many of the staff at **Menno Home W2** – from the cleaning crew, meal crew and care aides, took a moment to give mom a hug and love. I cannot express how much I appreciated this. It was a gift like no other.

Menno Hospital East 1 - I feel very positive in all areas of mom's care. I am informed any time something is happening – big or small – or if something has changed. I am very happy. The caregivers are amazing!

Now for the special awards. This year, we opened up the nominations for these awards to staff, residents and family members. We received 86 nominations -1/2 from Family & Friends and 1/2 from Team Members.

It was a complete joy to read the nominations, knowing that many of the nominations came directly from the people who are served here at Menno Place. What did the residents and families say about the people who serve them?

Here are some examples:

Ash of Menno Home E1 exemplifies the values of Menno Place through her practice. She is an excellent nurse and demonstrates great communication with fellow staff members, families, and residents in E1. Ash provides respectful, compassionate care for our residents and families which is evident in the relationships she has built with them. No matter how busy she is on the unit, Ash always makes herself available to answer questions and provide help to others. In addition to the excellent care Ash provides as an LPN, she also demonstrates herself as a leader and would often encourage staff members in their work. She also teaches GPA (Gentle Persuasion Approach) to the staff members in order to assist them in providing safe care to the residents..

My mother, Elsie gives positive feedback about the kind and respectful care she receives from **Nellie**, **E2 Hospital**. She takes an interest in Elsie and is gentle when transferring her to the wheelchair and commode and responds to Elsie's

preferences and remembers to put a cushion behind her back in wheelchair. I have also observed that Nellie is friendly, respectful, smiles and takes an interest to ensure that her day is off to a good start!

I don't know the names of all the staff at **Primrose Gardens**, however I really would like to nominate the entire staff, as I feel they all deserve recognition for a job well done. **Hilda in dietary** has been there since my mother moved in, and has been so caring. **Brenda** at the front desk, **John** the pastor, and the rest of the **kitchen staff** have been kind and considerate of all residents. I spend a lot of time there, and see the interaction of staff and residents, and all residents are treated with respect. I commend the Menno Society for their hiring, and instilling their values to all staff, whether resident-facing or behind the scenes. Definitely a job well done.

Menno Home - Bella is a wonderful and caring nurse. She shows competence and compassion for all our residents and families.

Robin works in Hospital housekeeping and is a bright spot every time I visit my father. She is an amazing dedicated worker, working through her own physical difficulty...often. She greets all and anyone...visitors and residents alike. She is genuinely interested in the lives of the residents and takes time to talk and listen to them. Plus she does an amazing job of keeping the care home clean.

Danielle has been my main contact at Menno hospital West 2 since my mother arrived in April 2018. I am always amazed at Danielle's patience and compassion. Danielle is always eager to help me in anyway that she can, signing Mom up for haircuts or pedicures. She helps me to understand what is happening with my mother, it is a constant source of comfort and guidance. I think that all of the staff that work at Menno Hospital are truly amazing and I think God every day for them. Danielle goes that extra step further in connecting with my mom, and I am very grateful for her and the care that she provides.

Ajay in Menno Hospital was incredible in dealing with a situation with my mom. He resolved it quickly and our concerns were heard and dealt with. This is a sign of a good leader, if he cares then it will resonate with the other staff as well.

From the initial contact we made with **Menno Apartments**, **Nik** was amazing. Always respectful, knowledgeable and very personable. I am sure he is a busy man but when talking with him he listens and makes you feel at ease and that he truly cares. He made our father's transition to his apartment suite easy.

Liesa, a housekeeper in Primrose Gardens goes above and beyond with helping my dad in PG. She see's the little extra things dad appreciates and does them with a joyful heart. Dad comments all the time how much he appreciates her and her visits during her work time. She works efficiently, but always takes time to visit with dad while she works. Dad appreciates her alot.

On **W2** at **Menno Home**, Veerpal genuinely reflects Menno Place values in every way. Co operative with each and every resident, family member, colleagues and Leadership Team. I had the privilege of working with her both on afternoon and night shift. I can honestly recommend her for her patience, kindness, diligence, and warm bright smile. Veerpal is very effective and efficient in serving all people she truly is respectful of everyone.

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Each of you makes such a difference to the lives of the residents and families – and your heart and care is noticed!

I witnessed Chhalander on multiple occasions keeping an eye out for the security of the building and the safety of the tenants. She reports directly to the nurse-in-charge when something in the building needs attention and suggests to report immediately to maintenance aside from only entering data in the Worx-hub program.

She always notices anomalies in tenant's behavior and relays her concerns to the nurses, for tenant to be assessed by the nurse immediately to take necessary action, ie. tenant possibly suffering from delirium.

This is what was shared on Darlene's nomination:

Darlene created an organizational method for all blister pack medications, for tenants who are being assisted with medications by care staff. She placed the blister packs delivered directly from Rexall Pharmacy to one side of the med drawer and blister packs from all other pharmacies are placed on the other side, then she created a roadmap (a guide) attached to the outside of the drawer for easier identification of tenant's medications and their respective pharmacy.

With the above medication system, it makes it easier for the nurses to identify which pharmacy each tenant is dealing with and easier to see if there is a need to contact the pharmacy for medication refill.

Darlene V's organizational skills and attention to details is exceptional. It is witnessed throughout our department, all her efforts to make our workplace more efficient and safe to work
